- 2) **BSc Health Professional Studies (Hons)** - This degree has been designed to enable those who work in the health and social care sector to develop their knowledge and skills. Students can select from a range of modules, enabling them to plan a course of study that is relevant to their individual needs. Both core module must be successfully achieved prior to this award being given.
- 3) **Professional Development Qualification Scheme (PDQS)** – These can be accessed as stand-alone modules. This scheme is designed to enable applicants to access individual modules of study that are of specific interest to them in their professional development rather than having to register for a full programme of study.
