## **DECLARATION OF CRIMINAL CONVICTIONS**

## Guidance

All applicants who accept an offer from the University are required to disclose to the University any relevant, unspent criminal convictions.

## Is the conviction for a 'relevant' offence?

This is the first element to the question we ask. Relevant offences include one or more of the following:

- Any kind of violence including (but not limited to) threatening behaviour, offences concerning the intention to harm or offences which resulted in actual bodily harm
- Sexual offences, including those listed in the Sexual Offences Act 2003
- The unlawful supply of controlled drugs or substances where the conviction concerns commercial drug dealing or trafficking (drug offences only involving possession are not relevant offences)
- Offences involving firearms
- Offences involving arson
- Offences involving terrorism

If you were convicted outside the United Kingdom for an offence listed above, this is also considered a relevant offence.

For the purposes of this question, cautions, reprimands and final warnings are considered as convictions. Penalty notices for disorder (PNDs), anti-social behaviour orders (ASBOs) or other orders are not convictions, unless you have contested a PND or breached the terms of an ASBO or other order and this has resulted in a criminal conviction.

## Is the conviction 'unspent'?

A criminal conviction can become 'spent' after a period of time. The length of time it takes to become spent is defined by the Rehabilitation of Offenders Act 1974 and depends on the sentence or disposal made by the court following the conviction. Until that period has passed, the conviction is considered 'unspent'. Convictions that are spent or will be spent at the point of starting the course do not need to declared. If you are uncertain as to whether your conviction is spent, please seek independent advice.
