We do not employ counsellors - however we do provide a mental health and wellbeing team staffed by professionals (social work/mental health nursing). The team provide a needs led service offering a range of contact including initial assessment, Triage, safeguarding, risk management as well as one to one therapeutic interventions with students. We also contract associate practitioners whose role is to offer psycho educative and therapeutic interventions to students based on current need. We offer up to 4 sessions and where a student is assessed as requiring treatment or longer term mental health support, we work with them to identify the best referral route. We work closely with a number of local specialist services including IAPT to ensure referral routes are as timely and accessible as possible.

We do not keep data on waiting times therefore data not held.
