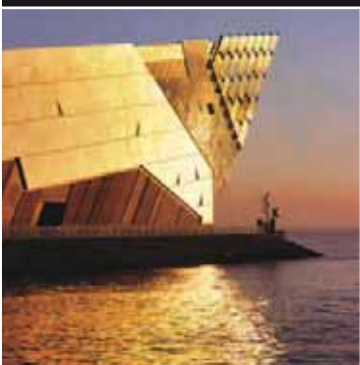

Within 15 minutes' drive of Hull, you will find the beautiful countryside of the Yorkshire Wolds, traditional market towns and picture postcard English Villages. Travel a little further and the dramatic coastline of East Yorkshire awaits you from all the fun and excitement of Bridlington - the traditional seaside resort to the tranquillity and beauty of Spurn Point. Alternatively head south over the magnificent Humber Bridge and the county of Lincolnshire awaits you.

# Museums and Galleries

Hull's unique **Museums Quarter** - consisting of Wilberforce House, the Hull & East Riding Museum, Streetlife and the Arctic Corsair trawler - is simply the best place to start your discovery of historic Hull.

You'll find it on High Street in the heart of the Old Town, on the banks of the River Hull, with the old warehouses, merchant dwellings, staithes, lanes and pubs nearby all lending their unique flavour to this historic district.

**Wilberforce House** was the birthplace and residence of the city's most celebrated son, William Wilberforce, the Hull Member of Parliament who campaigned against the slave trade in the 19th century. The house reopens on the 25th March 2007 after a multimillion-pound refurbishment, forming the centrepiece in the city's commemorations of the bicentenary of the abolition of the slave trade in the British Empire.

New, innovative displays will review the history of slavery and the role of Wilberforce, and examine contemporary issues relating to the subject of slavery. The installation of a lift and improved visitor services will ensure access for all. An exciting feature of

this development is the display and conservation of William Wilberforce's personal library, which will be presented to the public, in its entirety, for the very first time.

Just next door, the **Streetlife Museum** tells the story of 200 years of transport in Hull. Old and young alike will enjoy climbing aboard the old corporation tram, getting their bones shaken on the simulated mail-coach ride and taking in the sights, sounds and smells (phew!) of a steam locomotive goods station. Then there's the motor car gallery, the bicycle gallery, the toy displays, the old shops... and real trawlermen share their experiences on board the **Arctic Corsair\***, a 1960s sidewinder trawler permanently berthed on the River Hull.

Adjoining Streetlife is the **Hull & East Riding Museum**, which tells the amazing story of Hull and East Yorkshire from the beginning of geological time, through the early tribes, Saxon and Roman invaders, all the way up to the 17th century, when the city we see today really began to take shape. Exhibits such as the Hasholme boat, the mysterious Roos Carr figures and a fine display of Roman mosaics have international archaeological significance.





At the **Hull Maritime Museum**, discover Hull's rich maritime history, the story of whaling and deep-sea fishing in the frozen Arctic seas. The museum houses a fine collection of scrimshaw, the folk-art popular with sailors, who would carve and etch pictures into the bones and teeth of whales.

**Ferens Art Gallery** is one of the finest provincial art galleries in the country. The Ferens has an extensive and internationally renowned permanent collection, which spans from European Old Masters - including Frans Hals - through to modern British artists like Helen Chadwick, as well as a marine art collection and children's gallery. The gallery also runs a busy programme of high-quality touring exhibitions.

The **Hands On History Museum** is located in the Old Grammar School, in the shadow of the magnificent Holy Trinity church. The museum is a great way for kids (and parents!) to get involved with history. Discover

childhood in the Victorian era, play the game of life and learn about the real lives of the people of Hull, and get spooked by a genuine Egyptian mummy!

Visit **Spurn Lightship\*** for an insight into life on the Humber estuary; built in 1927, it is now permanently moored in the Marina.

## Shop 'til you drop

Throughout the city centre there is a wide range of well-known and independent stores plenty for everyone to explore.

In Hepworth's Arcade (Silver Street / Lowgate), lovers of vintage clothing will find plenty to rummage through, from ball-gowns and 70s gear to skate and club wear. Savile Street and George Street are now established as a home to designer clothing in Hull. All the high-street brands can be found in Princes Quay and Prospect Shopping Centres.

Hull's Trinity Quarter is at the heart of the historic Old Town. It offers a vibrant and exciting experience. It's home to Trinity Market, a traditional indoor market where local traders offer a fantastic selection of fresh produce.

A visit to the "Avenues" is also not to be missed. Here you will find a unique and exciting array of shops and boutiques.

Shopping in Hull is also set to get even better in autumn 2007, with the opening of the exciting St Stephen's development. St Stephen's will be more than just a retail destination - it will be home to over 30 stores and a 24-hour supermarket, but will also boast a hotel and leisure, dining and entertainment facilities.



# Wilberforce 2007

In 2007, Hull will be at the centre of the world's commemorations for the Slave Trade Act, which was passed 200 years ago in March. The Act was led by Hull's MP at the time, William Wilberforce.

A year-long programme of events is planned. Expect international, high-profile performances, gigs and guests, and world-class lectures - something for all ages and interests.

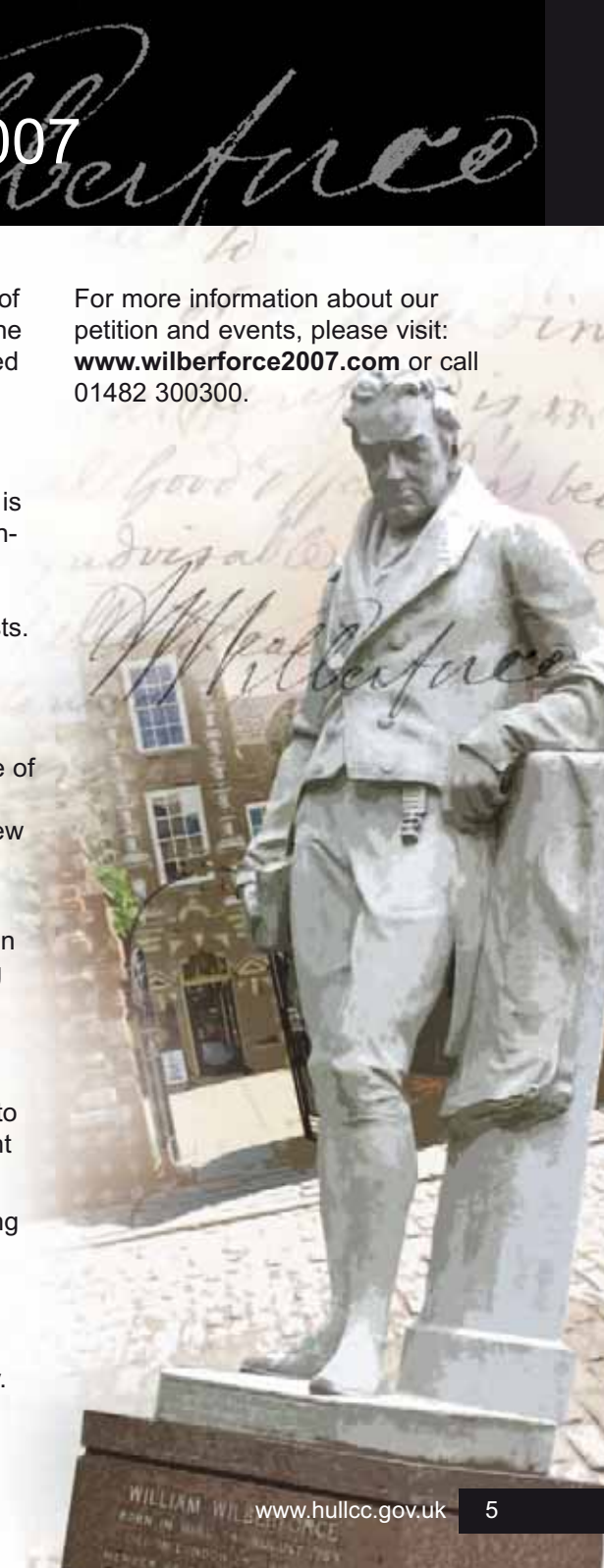
Sunday 25th March marks the anniversary of the abolition of slavery, and Wilberforce House museum (the birthplace and home of Wilberforce) will reopen after a £1.6 million refurbishment, with new displays and interactive features.

The life and achievements of Wilberforce will be brought to life in a Hollywood feature film, *Amazing Grace*, due for release in March.

In July, the shores of the Humber will be teeming with activity as we host a spectacular warm-up race to the Clipper Round-the-World Yacht Race 07/08, the Wilberforce Cup.

Throughout 2007, we will be asking people, just as Wilberforce did in 1807, to add their support to the Fight for Freedom campaign, a petition that aims to lobby for the eradication of modern-day slavery.

Hull City regularly draw crowds of 20,000 plus, whilst the stadium is regularly filled to capacity when host to major gigs. Recent crowd-pullers have included Elton John, Simply Red and Bon Jovi.

spectacular views of the city, The Deep, The Humber Bridge and surrounding countryside. Exclusive "wildlife spotting" trips to South Ferriby are also available for those looking for a unique view of the Humber wildlife.

## Green city

Hull's parks and gardens are beautiful, relaxing spaces which host a range of activities and events enjoyed by the whole community.

**East Park**, Hull's largest park, has recently benefited from a council assisted lottery grant totalling £10 million, and has been transformed into one of the premier park venues in the north of England. Features now include an education centre, deer park, water sports, water-based play facilities and a new central pavilion and café building.

**West Park**, next to the Kingston Communications Stadium, features aviaries, a pirate park play area and wide open spaces. Excellent sporting facilities are also available in and around the Gemtec Arena in the park.

**Queen's Gardens** - a calm, safe and attractive open space in the city centre. The perfect place for a picnic

when the weather's fine, and has regular live music and events during the summer months.

**Pearson Park**, between Prince's Avenue and Beverley Road, still resonates with Victorian grandeur and features an excellent play area and a conservatory with birds, reptiles and fish.

The acclaimed poet Philip Larkin lived in a house overlooking Pearson Park from 1956 -1974. Larkin was heavily influenced by the city, and on an autumn afternoon in the park you can experience something of the particular atmosphere that pervades much of his work.



# Take a stroll

Guided walks are a fun and exciting way to finding your bearings, and Hull has a whole array of walks for visitors to use to explore the delights of the city.

**Guided Old Town Walks** with a friendly and knowledgeable English Heritage Accredited Tour Guide depart from Hull Tourist Information Centre on a daily basis between April and October. The tour will take you on a journey through Hull's historic streets, exploring the city's rich history. For the less faint-hearted, join the **Hull Ghost Walk** and see if you can endure the city's scares, scandals and haunted history. For further information, please contact Hull Tourist Information Centre (tel 01482 223559).

For something slightly different, look out for the city's unique fish trail. Pick up a leaflet on the **Seven Seas Fish Trail** from Hull Tourist

Information Centre and follow an A-Z of fish swimming across Hull's pavements through the city centre, Old Town and down to the city's magnificent waterfront. Forty-one fish in total - find them all and net yourself a certificate on completion. Its great fun for everyone!

May 2007 will see the launch of a new self-guided tour around Hull's Old Town, created to commemorate the 200th anniversary of the abolition of the slave trade. This new tour, "**Walking with Wilberforce**", will look at William Wilberforce the man and his links with Hull. People will be taken on a journey through Hull that Wilberforce knew and along the way visit places that were important to Wilberforce during his life. These include Holy Trinity Church - the place where he was baptised; his first school, The Old Grammar School; and his birthplace, Wilberforce House.

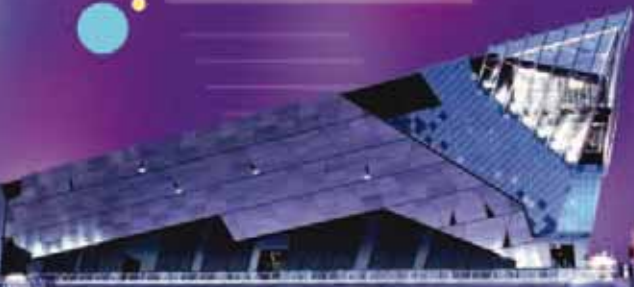

## East Riding

Just a short journey from the city itself, you can enjoy the rugged Yorkshire coastline, explore the green and rolling landscape of the Wolds or discover the charming market towns and villages of rural East Yorkshire.

The East Riding has something of an untouched quality. Take a walk along the Yorkshire Wolds Way or drive through quiet country lanes - you'll feel a world away from modern city life. Your reward will be wide, open views and lush green valleys, traditional country pubs and grand country houses like Sewerby Hall, Sledmere House, Burton Agnes Hall and Burton Constable Hall each with their own piece of history to tell.

Twenty minutes from Hull, the ancient market town of Beverley is dominated by its awe-inspiring Gothic Minster, dating from 1220. The bustling centre is full of

interesting shops, galleries, cafés, pubs and restaurants, while Beverley Westwood is an attractive, windswept common that sits above the town, with the ancient Beverley Racecourse nearby.

Beverley is fast gaining a reputation as festival hub, with events that celebrate literature, jazz, folk, early music and 'Gagaku', Yorkshire's Japanese festival of ancient imperial music and dance.

The traditional seaside resort of Bridlington has long been popular with holidaymakers and day-trippers alike, with its busy harbour, miles of award-winning beaches and historical Old Town. This year, Bridlington promises fabulous views over the bay onboard the new Eye on the Bay, a 120ft observation wheel, while Withernsea and Hornsea continue to evoke pleasure and nostalgia, with fishing



competitions, open-air concerts, afternoon teas and fish suppers.

Land, sea and sky seem to meet at Spurn Point. Home to Britain's only full-time lifeboat crew, Spurn has a magical and timeless edge-of-the-world quality that must be experienced.

Further up the coast at Flamborough, the landscape changes again; the sea carves dramatic shapes from chalk cliffs and the craggy coves provide shelter for thousands of seabirds.



## Time to refuel

From traditional alehouses to cosmopolitan café bars, Hull has got it all.

The Old Town of Hull is a great place to head to sample some of Hull's many traditional alehouses, and a warm welcome awaits you through every door. Visit Ye Olde Black Boy, Hull's oldest pub, dating back from 1729, or the city's most historic pub, Ye Olde White Harte. Allegedly, this is where the plotting for the Civil War took place in 1642. Discover the secrets of Hull's traditional taverns by picking up a free copy of Hull's Ale Trail.

For those seeking a more relaxed evening, take a stroll down to Prince's Avenue, with its contemporary café bars – Dukes, Pave, Fudge, Caesars, Garbutts and The Lounge all offer continental style and laid-back-easy-going atmosphere.

When it comes to dining out, you will find a global array of mouth-watering cuisine to choose from. Cerutti's is the place to head for seafood lovers, Hitchcock's is an excellent vegetarian buffet restaurant and if Spanish tapas is your flavour, Zilli's is a popular café bar in Trinity Square where you can dine with the stunning backdrop of Holy Trinity Church.



# Nightlife . . .

Theatre, live music and clubs - Hull is not a city that falls asleep after dark.

An evening at one of Hull's two theatres is always a fabulous time; choose between world premieres of John Godber's latest plays at Hull Truck Theatre and some of the best in musicals, opera, ballet, drama and one-night performances at Hull New Theatre.

Fans of live music should not spend a night in the city without a visit to the New Adelphi Club on De Grey Street. The club is one of the last underground music venues in the country and has played host to everyone, including The Housemartins, Happy Mondays, Oasis, Pulp and Radiohead. Look out for gigs on stage at City Hall and Hull's Ice Arena – the Sugar babes, Beautiful South, Bob Geldof and Status Quo have all performed there recently.

There is plenty of choice on offer for those wishing to dance the night away. Waterfront Club on Prince's Dock Street is a regular host of excellent party nights, boasting 3 floors, 7 bars and 3 styles of music. Pozition, on George Street, is well worth a visit too, with its rooftop garden, café bar and diversity of dance floors and music. Lovers of dance music should head to Rhythm Rooms, where those with the energy can dance until the early hours.

The city also has a blossoming 'attitude free' scene, with bars and clubs welcoming punters regardless of their sexuality. Look out for The Polar Bear pub (Spring Bank), Fuel Bar (Baker Street), Frankie's Vauxhall Tavern Pub (Hessle Road) and Lattitude bar bistro (Newland Avenue).

By road, take the M62 motorway eastbound and it will bring you straight into Hull

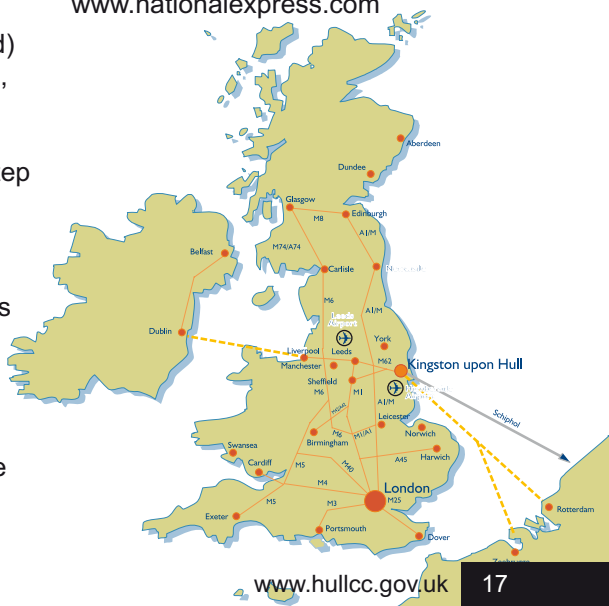

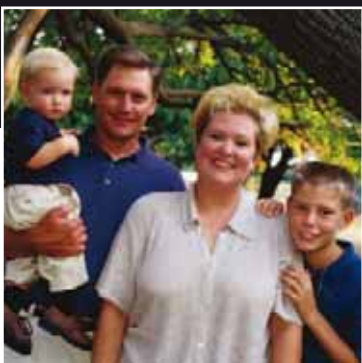

## Hotels

The different hotel categories are: Hotel, Small Hotel, Country House Hotel, Town House Hotel and Budget Hotel, which you will see displayed on the marquee below the star ratings.
