5 reasons to choose university

1. It boosts their career prospects

Going to university can give a big advantage in the jobs market. It's no coincidence that 95% of our students are in work or further study fifteen months after graduating¹. A university qualification also tells an employer much more about your child than just their academic ability. It can demonstrate lots of other skills that employers value.

3. It pays off. Literally.

Graduates usually earn more money – about £10,000 more per year on average². Student finance is available and they only need to start paying the loans back when they're earning enough. Plus, loans are written off after 30 years if they haven't paid them back in full.

There are courses to suit all ranges of abilities and interests. Plus, we have a wide range of support available, which is tailored to individual needs. We also offer Foundation courses before taking on a full degree, where needed.



Timeline of key dates

When your young person applies to Hull, they'll have a specialist team ready to answer their questions every step of the way. From starting their application to the day they arrive on campus, and beyond.



EARLY SEPTEMBER 2024

UCAS applications open

Applications can now be sent via the UCAS system providing all areas are fully complete.



MID OCTOBER 2024



The main deadline to apply for most courses in medicine, dentistry and veterinary science. Applications can be submitted after the deadline, but universities do not need to consider them equally to those submitted on time.



LATE JANUARY 2025

UCAS applications deadline for all other courses

The main deadline for most undergraduate courses. Submitting an application before this deadline gives your young person the best chance of securing the course or university they want.



LATE FEBRUARY 2025



If your young person has used all five choices on their UCAS application but not received an offer, UCAS Extra gives them the opportunity to make one additional application.



LATE JUNE 2025

Main UCAS application scheme closes

The final deadline to submit an application as part of the main UCAS cycle. Any applications submitted after this deadline are automatically entered into Clearing.



EARLY JULY 2025

UCAS Extra closes

The final chance for students to submit that extra choice via UCAS if they've received no offers.

Clearing is how to get a place at university if your young person doesn't already have one – for whatever reason.



A quick guide to Clearing

So your child is applying to go to university. But you've heard about Clearing too. What is it? Who is it for? And how does it work?

What is Clearing?

When universities have places left on any of their courses, they offer them through Clearing from July to October. The majority of students applying for university each year don't need to use the Clearing system, but it's worth knowing a little about it because there are a few reasons why your young person might find it useful...

Who is Clearing for?

It can be for everyone, and students use it for different reasons.

It's the opportunity to get a place if your young person decides they do want to go to university after all and have missed other application deadlines.

But it's also used by students who have applied much earlier. If they do better or worse in their exams than planned, for example, Clearing gives them the choice to reapply or upgrade.

It's also the freedom to change their mind. To switch to a course – and a university – that's really right for them.
