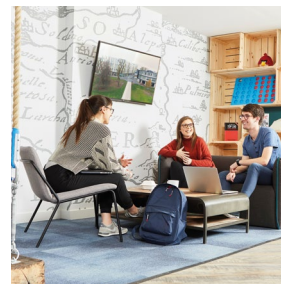

After your Applicant Day ... *What's next?*

We hope your visit gives you a great feel for what it's like to be a student here at Hull, and you'll have all your questions answered. But in case you're wondering, here's what happens next.

If you don't yet have an offer..

Some courses require us to interview you before we can give you an offer. If that's the case for you, we'll keep in touch while we consider your application and we'll get back to you as soon as possible.

If you have a conditional offer...

Received an offer from us? Congratulations! If it's conditional, you can still make us your firm choice and we'll confirm your place on Results Day once you meet certain entry requirements.

If you have an unconditional offer...

If your offer from us is unconditional, you can secure your place straight away by accepting our offer as your firm choice.

Firm choice

This is your way of saying which university or course is your preferred choice.

Insurance choice

This is your back-up choice. This could be in case you don't meet the conditions of your firm choice.

How do I confirm my choice?

Remember to wait until you've had all your offers so you can make an informed choice. Then when you've decided, log in to your UCAS account and pick your firm and insurance choice. If you receive all your offers by 14 May, you'll need to do this by 5 June.
