

GREAT-Hull Scholarships 2019 Information and Guidance

Background

The University of Hull, in partnership with the British Council, is pleased to announce the GREAT-Hull Scholarships 2019. They are available to Indonesian students interested in studying a **full time, undergraduate programme** starting in **September 2019**.

Award

- 4 x £5,000 (GBP) for students studying on any full time, Hull based Science programme.
- 2 x £5,000 (GBP) for students studying on any full time, Hull based Arts programme.

The GREAT-Hull scholarship will be awarded as a tuition fee discount.

Duration of award

1 year.

Eligibility

To be eligible for a GREAT-Hull scholarship, all applicants must:

- be an Indonesian national and normally resident in Indonesia
- have received an offer of study from the University of Hull
- have met the University's English language requirements for the chosen course of study by May 2019 (students studying on a University of Hull pre-session course will still be considered but this should be made clear in the application form).
- have completed a GREAT-Hull application form and have answered the following two questions (maximum 250 word limit per question):
 1. Please explain how the GREAT-Hull scholarship will help in your studies at the University of Hull.
 2. Please explain how your studies at the University of Hull will help in your future career.

Obligations and Responsibilities of Awardees

Scholars will endeavour to support the University of Hull and in particular the International Office during the course of their studies, where reasonably possible. This will include, but not be limited to, completing an International Student Testimonial form towards the end of the first year of study, and undertaking promotional activities whilst in the scholar's home country (where appropriate and approved).

Restrictions:

- The award applies to international (non-EU) students of Indonesian nationality making applications for entry to a 3 year, full time, Hull based undergraduate degree programme.

International Office

- The Scholarship is payable as a credit against tuition fees only and does not cover living expenses.
- No application for a Scholarship shall be considered without the University having first received an undergraduate application form.
- Scholarship applications must be submitted before the closing date of 30 May 2019. •
- Scholarships may only be awarded to applicants satisfying general university, departmental and programme of study regulations.
- The quality of the answers to the two questions detailed above, will be taken into consideration by the International Scholarships Awarding Committee and must be the applicants own unassisted work.
- No guarantee of a scholarship can be made where an applicant indicates that he/she wishes to defer entry beyond 2019/20.
- All applicants must be able to demonstrate to the University that they have the necessary living expenses as required under UKVI regulations prior to the University issuing a Tier 4 certificate of sponsorship. If applicants are not able to demonstrate that they have the necessary living expenses by 1 August 2018, the offer of the scholarship may be withdrawn.
- No Scholar may hold more than one University award.
- If you have been awarded a scholarship, you will be notified in writing. Students must respond to the initial e-mail within 72 hours of being awarded the scholarship. If a response has not been received, the award may be given to another applicant.
- Only one application form per student can be accepted.

Application Deadline

The deadline for submitting GREAT-Hull applications is **30 May 2019**. Late applications will not be considered.

Selection

Only those applications meeting the criteria stated above will be sent to the scholarship board for final assessment. The scholarship board will assess successful applications based on the answers provided to the questions in the GREAT-Hull Application Form. The scholarship board will be looking for the very highest academic achievers who have given full and relevant answers to the questions asked. Application should reflect applicants' abilities and motivation as well as how they intend to use their experience and knowledge from studying this course. They will also look at applicant's professional experience and career aspirations and how committed applicants are to contributing to society, their country and the university after this course.
