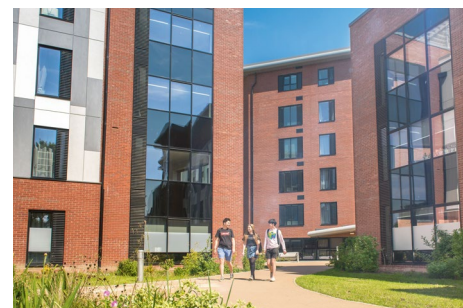

After your Offer Holder Day... What's next?

We hope your visit gives you a great feel for what it's like to be a student here at Hull, and you'll have all your questions answered. But in case you're wondering, here's what happens next.

If you don't yet have an offer...

Some courses require us to interview you before we can give you an offer. If that's the case for you, we'll keep in touch while we consider your application and we'll get back to you as soon as possible.

If you have a conditional offer...

Once you've met these requirements, we'll confirm your place in the summer on your UCAS account.

If you have an unconditional offer...

If there are no other conditions of entry, you can secure your place by accepting our offer as your firm choice. But remember to keep studying and working hard.

Firm choice

This is your way of saying which university or course is your preferred choice.

Insurance choice

This is your back-up choice. This could be in case you don't meet the conditions of your firm choice.

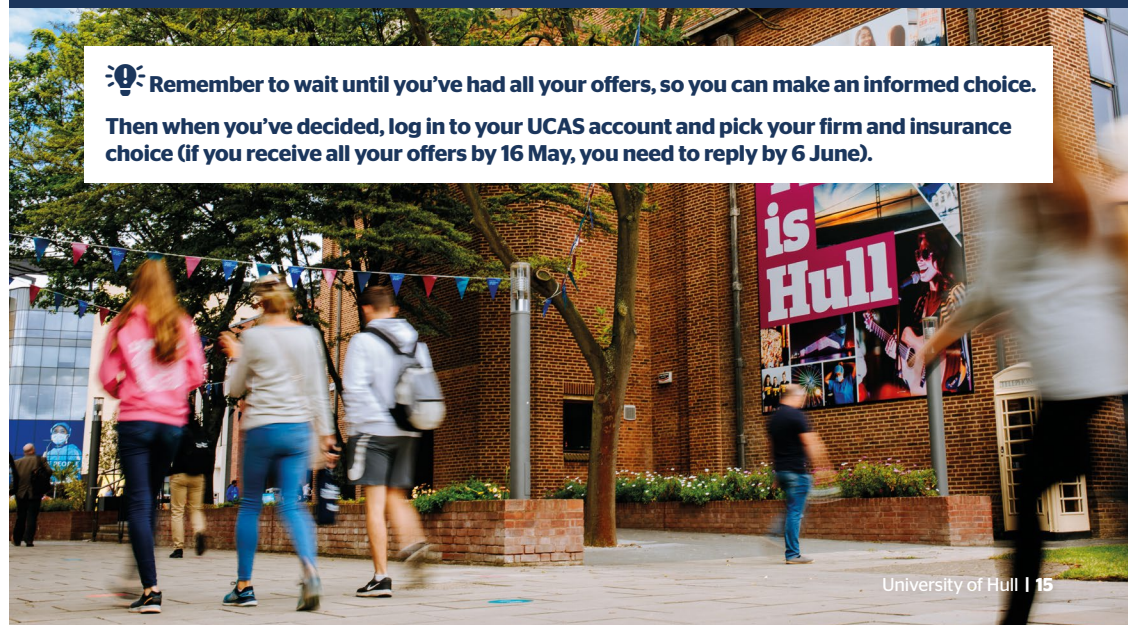
Your insurance option is usually a university or course with lower entry requirements, which gives you the chance to keep your options open.
