## **Response**

- We do not hold this information as it is only a coroner who can confirm a suicide.
- We have a suicide Safer policy that adheres to UUK and Papyrus guidance and is fully evidence based.
- We don't have an opt-in scheme. All concerns for a student's wellbeing are passed to our Mental Health and Wellbeing Team, which consists of fully trained and qualified mental health social workers and nurses. The team continually assess when to inform a student's emergency contact of concerns, considering data protection and confidentiality guidelines. Students are encouraged and supported to inform family, guardians, and friends of difficulties they are experiencing. We find this approach a much more robust way of supporting our students, as specific consent is only fully relevant at the time of it being given, as a lot can change in a year regarding relationships with families, guardians, and friends.
